Art	Artwork: Each student has a sketchbook that stays in the department. Homework: is on loose leaves and carried to and from school. Specialist pencils are provided.				
Business	N/A		Written Work: A4 Ring binder file. File kept in school. Students require A4 folder for transporting work. Homework: Weekly on paper or pc and handed in.		
Dance	N/A		Written Work: Students are required to bring an A4 file which will be kept in school. Booklets to be taken home for revision purposes. Homework: Extra rehearsals outside of lessons especially before performances. Written homework is completed on file paper or on the computer at home.		
Drama	Written work: Any written work is completed on worksheets and kept in school. No books required. Homework: Students may be asked to learn lines, develop an idea from the lesson and occasionally make / find props and costumes. Note: Due to the nature of Drama activities with movement, use of floor space etc. trousers are preferred over skirts.		Written work: At different times in the course students have a drama exercise book, a set text, a performance text and / or props and costumes which should be brought in when required. Homework: Sometimes done in exercise books and sometimes done on file paper. Sometimes homework means doing extra rehearsals outside of lessons, especially when coming up to a performance exam. Students should bring costumes and or props when prompted.		
English	Written work: All KS3 classes have A5 exercise books. Note that some teachers may keep these in school at times for marking. Homework: is completed in the exercise books.		Written work: All KS4 classes have A4 wallets that completed work is stored in some teachers may keep the actual files in school for marking and record keeping. Homework: is completed on file paper Students require an A4 ring binder.

ICT/Computing	Written work: Completed on computers and stored on school server. Homework: At KS3 all tasks are Moodle based. At KS4 all homework is completed electronically. Additional information: students to remember and not disclose their Username and Password.				
Lifeskills	Written work: All KS3 classed have A5 yellow exercise books. These are usually taken home unless they are required for marking. Homework: is completed in exercise books and is marked clearly as homework. Where separate sheets are used, these should be stuck inside exercise books.			Written work: All KS4 classes have A4 exercise books. These are usually taken home unless being marked by the teacher. Homework: is completed in exercise books. Where separate sheets are used, these are stuck inside exercise books	
Maths	Written work: Exercise books travel with the student to and from lessons. Homework: is completed in the exercise book.				
MFL	Written work: Books purple (A5) given to students (sometimes collected in and stored in teaching rooms). Homework: can be done on sheets, separate materials or into books. Optional: coloured pencils are often useful.			Written work: Books (purple A4) given to students (sometimes collected in and stored in teaching rooms). Homework: Exam wizard used to put together topic based L & R tests. Results of L & R tests, writings and translations are kept in personalised folders in class.	
Music	Written work: Folders are kept at school in classrooms. Homework: tasks at times require access to MOODLE on computers to complete quizzes/tasks. As a department, we continue to develop Google Classroom at KS3. If there is no computer access at home, computers may be accessed at school for homework in the library. Optional: some students choose to bring in their own headphones rather than using the schools.

Science	Written work: students have an exercise book for each subject area, Chemistry (red), Biology (green) Physics (blue), students responsible for their own book and expected to bring it to every lesson. Students are responsible for their own book and expected to bring it to every lesson. Homework is completed in their books. In addition to this all, students have an assessment file to store their end of topic tests in. These are kept by the classroom teacher.	
Tech	Written work: On paper provided by school. All folders are kept in school. Homework: Individual pages are carried around for homework Optional: Wallet or ring-binder to keep any transported pages neat, pencil crayons and a black fine line pen.
